From the Pastor's Desk:

Each and every person has a vocation. For most people this vocation, this "calling", is expressed through marriage and family life; for others, it may be as a single person; it may be as a Diocesan priest; and for still others, it will be in a religious community as a priest, permanent deacon, brother or sister. How is it that we know which call to follow, which call is right for me? This can be a difficult question to answer and needs to be discerned very carefully.

As a member of a religious community of men, the Congregation of the Resurrection, my desire is to see my religious community continue, thus new members are always needed. I have a responsibility to invite people to consider a vocation as a member of my community. While extending an invitation is somewhat easy, the response to that invitation is far more complicated and detailed. However, the process of discerning God's call in your life is the same whether discerning priesthood, married life, or single life. Discernment at its simplest is a five step process.

Step one, prayer. In order to respond to God's call in your life you need to be in relationship with God, a relationship that is built upon a two-way communication, we call it prayer. The first step to discerning God's call is to develop a prayer relationship with God, to listen to God.

Step two, listen to yourself. Identify what brings joy and fulfillment to your life, what brings you peace and a sense of closeness with God. Let your own life and experiences be a guide to your discernment.

Step three, listen to others. Talk to those who know you, your family, parents and friends. Ask them to help you discern where God is calling you in your life.

Step four, follow your instincts. Discernment takes time, so move slowly. For example in the process of discerning marriage, dating is required, getting to know the other person to see if the relationship is right for you. In other words, do not rush into any vocation, listen to your instincts, pay attention to what is going on deep inside yourself to see if you are on the right path.

Finally, trust. When you have reached the point of decision-making trust that God will be with you in your choice; continue to invite God to journey with you. The end of discernment does not end your relationship with God, it now takes a different direction. Whatever vocation you discern in life, follow these five simple steps, trusting that God will not lead you astray.
